How to Read the Calls for Service printout:

Some of the fields on the printout are more informative than others. For example, the DETAIL field is merely a computer assigned number for that call. The CASE NUMBER field tells you if a police report was written. If this field is blank, no report was written. The PRD shows the Police Reporting District and the BT shows the Police Beat. The ADDRESS/ INTERSECTION field is self-explanatory, except if you asked for a range of addresses, they will be listed in order. The FINAL TYPE field shows the code used by the responding officer to show what kind of call it was. The COMPLAINT field shows the nature of the original call, which often is inaccurate, so we depend upon the FINAL TYPE field to know what happened. DP shows disposition, with "07" meaning a report was written, and "08" showing no report. The UNIT is the Call Sign of the responding officer. OFFID is the officer's ID. TIME.RECV shows the time the call was received at County Communications (in 24-hour, military time), while TOTAL TIME shows how long the officers were on the scene.

The Primary Codes listed on this sheet include the most commonly used codes, but we couldn't possibly list every code used. Even if you find a code on the printout which is not on this sheet, if the printout has a similar code with the first two or three digits the same, the crime is probably very similar. We hope this information makes the printout more useful.

How to Read the Calls for Service printout:

Some of the fields on the printout are more informative than others. For example, the DETAIL field is merely a computer assigned number for that call. The CASE NUMBER field tells you if a police report was written. If this field is blank, no report was written. The PRD shows the Police Reporting District and the BT shows the Police Beat.
